Safety Patrols

2nd-5th Grade students have the opportunity to expand their leadership and role model skills by applying to be an AAA Safety Patrol. Among other duties, Patrols escort students into the school building before school begins.

After-School Clubs

K-5th Grade students have the opportunity to participate in numerous after-school clubs that are hosted by our teachers. Clubs include cooking, art, movement, reading/writing and gardening. These clubs are offered to our students at a nominal fee.

Field Day

The entire Primary School, including many parents, get together for a fun-filled day of sun and water for our annual field day at Dr. Phillips Park. Students participate in Olympic-style events, play in the water park and state of the art playground. Lunch is provided by the PTO.

K-5th Grades take monthly field trips to the downtown Orange County Library.
